What is the Family Literacy Services Directory?

Designed to help you and your clients locate literacy and other educational services for children and families throughout New York City, the Family Literacy Services Directory is a resource for program directors, social service providers, community workers, parent coordinators, and others who provide direct services and support to children and families, as well as for parents, caregivers, family and community members.

What are "literacy services for families"?

Literacy services to families are very important in maintaining strong and resilient communities. Programs that offer literacy services may include any or all of the following: classes in English for Speakers of Other Languages (ESOL); adult basic education classes and GED classes, including reading writing, math and other subjects; workshops for parents to help them understand the public schools and advocate for their children; parenting classes on child development; early childhood education; after school and youth literacy programs.

How was this information collected?

The information in this directory was compiled via phone interviews and print surveys completed by program managers. Information was collected in September and October of 2006.

How can I add my literacy program to the directory?
